<a href="#">SB 252</a> (Gonzalez)  Introduced: 5/18/23	California Faculty Association, Fossil Free California	Prohibits the CalSTRS and CalPERS boards from making additional or new investments or renewing existing investments in a fossil fuel company, as defined, and requires divestment from such investments by July 1, 2031, unless and only until January 1, 2035, an unforeseeable event creates conditions that materially impact normal market mechanisms for pricing assets. Requires an annual report be submitted to the Legislature and Governor with specified information commencing February 1, 2025. Indemnifies present, former and future board members, officers and employees of and investment managers under contract with those retirement systems for actions related to the bill. <a href="#">SB 261</a> (Stern)  Amended: 7/12/23	Ceres	Requires a covered entity, as defined, to annually report their climate-related financial risks in accordance with the Task Force on Climate-Related Financial Disclosures' recommendations commencing on or before December 31, 2024. Requires a climate reporting organization, as defined, to review and analyze a subset of the reports, identify inadequate reports, convene representatives to offer input on disclosure and monitor certain federal regulatory actions. Requires the California Air Resources Board to seek administrative penalties of up to \$500,000 per reporting year from covered entities that are found to violate the requirements of the bill. 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<a href="#">SB 327</a> (Laird)  Amended: 5/2/23	CalSTRS	Effective upon a date no later than January 1, 2026, determined by the CalSTRS board, reduces the timeframe members may backdate their service retirement or service retirement during evaluation of a disability application from as early as January 1, 2012, or January 1, 2014, respectively, to up to 270 calendar days prior to when CalSTRS receives their application. <a href="#">SB 432</a> (Cortese)  Amended: 8/24/23	Author	Makes minor and conforming changes to Education Code sections added or amended by Chapter 754, Statutes of 2022 (AB 1667–Cooper).		Assembly Floor
<a href="#">SB 637</a> (Min)  Amended: 3/22/23	Author	Prohibits a state agency from entering into a contract with, depositing state funds with or receiving a loan from a financial institution that invests in or makes loans to a company that manufactures firearms or ammunition. <a href="#">SB 660</a> (Alvarado-Gil)  Amended: 3/21/23	El Dorado County Fire Protection District	Establishes the California Public Retirement System Agency Cost and Liability Panel, in the State Controller’s Office, with specified members, including an appointee from the CalSTRS board. Provides the responsibilities of the panel, which include determining the retirement benefit costs to public agencies under various circumstances that are incurred by participating in a public retirement system. Requires the panel to report its findings and recommendations to the Legislature, no later than December 31, 2024.		Senate Appropriations Committee (Suspense File)
<a href="#">SB 765</a> (Portantino)  Amended: 8/17/23	Superintendent of Public Instruction, CSBA	Increases the CalSTRS annual postretirement earnings limit from one-half to 70% of the median final compensation of all members who retired for service during the fiscal year ending in the previous calendar year. Modifies the process for obtaining an already-available exemption from the CalSTRS 180-calendar day separation-from-service requirement. Makes these provisions effective from July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2026, and requires CalSTRS to submit a report to the appropriate policy committees of the Legislature on postretirement work. 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<a href="#"><u>SB 885</u></a> (L,PE&R)  Amended: 6/6/23	CalSTRS	Makes a conforming change to the Teachers' Retirement Law to facilitate efficient administration of the State Teachers' Retirement Plan. Also makes various technical and conforming changes in the Public Employees' Retirement Law, the County Employees Retirement Law and the law related to the Judges' Retirement System II.	Sponsor	Governor's Desk
<a href="#"><u>SJR 1</u></a> (Cortese)  Chapters: 6/2/23	CalRTA	Requests the U.S. President and Congress to enact legislation that would repeal the Government Pension Offset (GPO) and the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) from the Social Security Act.	Support	Res. Chapter 84, Statutes of 2023
