Contact HICAP (cahealthadvocates.org or 800-434-0222) for assistance signing up for Medicare as soon as you're eligible. For most people, eligibility is reached at age 65.	
What	to do: Understand Social Security rules	
	Visit ssa.gov/gpo-wep to learn more about the Windfall Elimination Provision and Government Pension Offset. Contact the Social Security Administration for more information and benefit estimates.	
	Contact the Codal Cecurity / turning ration for more information and benefit estimates.	
What to do: Apply for retirement		
	Complete the Service Retirement Application no earlier than six months before your retirement date.	
	Submit your application via <i>my</i> CalSTRS for faster processing or submit a hard copy by fax, hand delivery or mail.	
	Provide the Express Benefit Report to your employer to complete and return to CalSTRS.	
What to do: Wait to work		
	Understand that you cannot earn any pay without affecting your retirement benefit if you return to work in the California public school system before the 180-calendar day separation-from-service requirement.	
	Track your gross earnings to avoid exceeding the annual postretirement earnings limit.	
What	t to do: Access convenient resources
